## **ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER LAND FUND ACCOUNT STATEMENT OF REVENUES AND EXPENSES YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2001**

---

The *Land Fund and Indigenous Land Corporation (ATSIC Amendment) Act 1995 (the Act)* provided for the establishment of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Fund (Land Fund) and the Indigenous Land Corporation (ILC) under part 4A of the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC) Act 1989 (ATSIC Act)*.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC) is required to keep accounts and prepare financial statements for the Land Fund under section 193H of the *ATSIC Act*. The Minister for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs must cause an annual report to be prepared about the administration of the Land Fund under section 193I. (1) of the *ATSIC Act*.

The ILC has distinct and quite separate reporting responsibilities, which are detailed in the section of this report covering the operation of that Authority.

### **Purpose of the Land Fund**

The Land Fund is to be built up to become a self-sustaining capital fund by 30 June 2004. It is to provide a secure and ongoing source of funds to the ILC to assist Indigenous peoples to buy and manage land in a sustainable manner to provide economic, environmental, social and cultural benefits.

### **Background**

Following the High Court's recognition in June 1992 of the concept of native title at common law (the 'Mabo' judgement), the Government of the day legislated to protect native title rights under the *Native Title Act 1993* in December 1993.

\$200 million was allocated to the Land Fund in 1994/95 as an interim measure under Part 10, Clause 201 of the *Native Title Act 1993*. As the specific legislative arrangements of the Land Fund had not been established, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet was given responsibility for investing this allocation under the interim arrangements.

The *ATSIC Amendment (Land Fund and Indigenous Land Corporation) Bill 1994* was presented to Parliament in June 1994. The Senate supported the amended Bill - now called the *Land Fund and Indigenous Land Corporation (ATSIC Amendment) Bill* - on 21 March 1995. The Act came into effect on 1 June 1995.

With the commencement of the Act, Part 10, Clause 201 of the *Native Title Act 1993* was repealed and balances held under the interim arrangements were transferred to the new Land Fund. Responsibility for managing Land Fund investments was transferred to ATSIC.

### **Land Fund Appropriations**

From 1995/96 until 2003/04, the Commonwealth Government each year will appropriate \$121 million (indexed to 1994 values) to the Land Fund. Approximately 63 per cent will be invested to build the capital base of the fund. The remaining 37 per cent will be administered by the ILC for its statutory land acquisition and land management responsibilities and for associated costs. The allocations will be indexed so as to maintain their value in real terms.

In 2004, Government allocations to the Land Fund will cease and the ILC will receive the realised real return on investments of the fund in the previous year. By this time it is envisaged that the capital base should be sufficient for the annual earnings to replace the Government appropriation, making it a perpetual fund.

The Land Fund itself, however, will remain the property of the Commonwealth.

The sixth special appropriation of \$139,223,000 took place on 3 July 2000, with \$51,777,000 being provided to the ILC. An amount of \$87,446,000 was invested in securities in accordance with section 39(8) of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997 (FMA Act)*.

In the 2001/02 financial year, \$52,606,000 will be drawn down for the ILC.

### **Structure of the Land Fund**

From 1 January 1998 the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Fund became a Reserved Fund within the Commonwealth Public Account. From that date monies placed in the Land Fund must be invested in accordance

with section 39(8) of the *Financial Management and Accountability (FMA) Act 1997*.

A further amendment to the *FMA Act*, constituting the replacement of the Reserved Money Fund by Special Accounts, took effect on 1 July 1999. The *Financial Management Legislation Amendment Act 1999* converted the Land Fund Reserve to a Special Account under section 20(1) of the *FMA Act* on 1 July 1999. As a consequence, the Land Fund Reserve became known as the Land Fund Account.

The Land Fund and its investments are administered by ATSIC under delegation from the Minister for Finance and Administration under section 193F. (1)&(2) of the *ATSIC Act*. The Chief Finance Officer, ATSIC, was appointed the Minister's Delegate for that purpose by the Minister for Finance and Administration on 25 July 1997.

### **Consultative Forum**

The Minister for Reconciliation and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Affairs appoints a Consultative Forum on the investment policy of the Land Fund (Consultative Forum). This is a Committee through which the nominated ILC Directors and other appointees of the Minister can provide advice about the investment policy of the Land Fund to the Delegate of the Minister for Finance and Administration.

The Consultative Forum, which met on two occasions in 2000/01, consists of the Delegate, at least two nominated ILC Directors and such other persons as the Minister considers appropriate.

### **Performance Indicators**

On 1 July 2000 the balance of the Land Fund stood at \$784,498,585.

On 3 July 2000 an amount of \$87,446,000 was appropriated to the Land Fund providing a base investment of \$871,944,585 (excluding accrued interest). The realised real return for the year 2000/01 was 6.19 percent per annum on the revalued portfolio (including reserves and receivables). This is based on an inflation indexation factor of 1.60 as determined under section 193D. (1) of the *ATSIC Act* and has been arrived at following the Australian Investment Management Association (AIMA) guidelines on performance standards.

The real return achieved on investments for 2000/2001 was in excess of the 3.70 percent per annum that was identified as the requirement at 30 June 2000 to reach the June 2004 target balance. While there was a good performance of the return on the Land Fund's investments for the financial year which has significantly reduced the on-going required real yield, this must be viewed in light of the strong recent performance of the fixed interest market – and in particular the Inflation-Linked Bond (ILB) market. A shortage in the supply of ILBs has exaggerated the fall in yields which has boosted the return on the Fund's investments (arguably artificially) in recent periods.

The Commonwealth Government is presently the only regular public sector issuer of ILBs and the intended program has declined to the point where, in the 2001/2002 financial year, the issuance will again only cover the coupon payments from existing ILBs available for re-investment.

The duration of the portfolio, while being kept to prudent levels, is nonetheless long enough to make it fairly sensitive to interest rate rises, from the currently historically low levels. Therefore, even what would be regarded

as quite a modest rise in real yields in some period prior to 30 June 2004, could result in capital losses, and hence a poor enough total portfolio return for the period, to jeopardise achievement of the Fund's 2004 target value. At 30 June 2001, the required real return to reach the target is 2.50 percent per annum.

Investments during the year were made in securities prescribed by the *FMA Act*. These included Commercial Bank Bills, Floating Rate Notes, Capital Indexed Bonds, Nominal Bonds and At Call Account.

### **Investment Strategy**

The Consultative Forum, in consultation with the Delegate of the Minister for Finance and Administration, directed that 2001/2002 appropriation monies be invested in ILBs and short to mid-term Nominals on an approximate 70-30 split. This strategy seeks to minimise the risk of a shortfall in the June 2004 target balance.

International investment consultants, Frank Russell Company Pty Ltd (Frank Russell) have continued to offer professional reviews of the performance of the Fund on a six-monthly basis. The company will be contracted by ATSIC again in 2001/2002 to provide advice on investments. Frank Russell continued to point out the risks of a shortfall in the target balance which have been the subject of a number of submissions from the Delegate to the Department of Finance and Administration (DoFA) seeking to broaden the investment powers of the Fund.

A further submission will be presented to the Minister for Finance and Administration in the first half of 2001/2002 to again stress the need for review of the investment powers of the Fund and the establishment of a formal reserving policy to ensure that the real value of the Fund is not eroded in the years post 2004.
