APPENDIX 1

ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER LAND FUND ACCOUNT STATEMENT OF REVENUES AND EXPENSES YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2002

The *Land Fund and Indigenous Land Corporation (ATSIC Amendment) Act 1995 (the Act)* provided for the establishment of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Fund (Land Fund) and the Indigenous Land Corporation (ILC) under part 4A of the *Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC) Act 1989 (ATSIC Act)*.

The Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC) is required to keep accounts and prepare financial statements for the Land Fund under section 193H of the *ATSIC Act*. The Minister for Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs must cause an annual report to be prepared about the administration of the Land Fund under section 193I(1) of the *ATSIC Act*.

The ILC has distinct and quite separate reporting responsibilities, which are detailed in the section of this report covering the operation of that Authority.

PURPOSE OF THE LAND FUND

The Land Fund is to be built up to become a self-sustaining capital fund by 30 June 2004. It is to provide a secure and ongoing source of funds to the ILC to provide economic, environmental, social and cultural benefits for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders by assisting in the acquisition and management of an Indigenous land base.

BACKGROUND

Following the High Court's recognition in June 1992 of the concept of native title at common law (the Mabo judgement), the Government of the day legislated to protect native title rights under the *Native Title Act 1993* in December 1993.

\$200 million was allocated to the Land Fund in 1994/95 as an interim measure under Part 10, Clause 201 of the *Native Title Act 1993*. As the specific legislative arrangements of the Land Fund had not been established, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet was given responsibility for investing this allocation under the interim arrangements.

The ATSIIC Amendment (Land Fund and Indigenous Land Corporation) Bill 1994 was presented to Parliament in June 1994. The Senate supported the amended Bill, now called the Land Fund and Indigenous Land Corporation (ATSIIC Amendment) Bill, on 21 March 1995. The Act came into effect on 1 June 1995.

With the commencement of the Act, Part 10, Clause 201 of the *Native Title Act 1993* was repealed and balances held under the interim arrangements were transferred to the new Land Fund. Responsibility for managing Land Fund investments was transferred to ATSIIC.

LAND FUND APPROPRIATIONS

From 1995/96 until 2003/04 (Category A years), the Commonwealth Government each year will appropriate \$121 million (indexed to 1994 values) to the Land Fund. Approximately 63% will be invested to build the capital base of the fund. The remaining 37 % will be administered by the ILC for its statutory land acquisition and land management responsibilities and for associated costs. The allocations will be indexed so as to maintain their value in real terms.

In 2004, Government allocations to the Land Fund will cease and in later years (Category B years) the ILC will receive the realised real return on investments of the fund in the previous year. By this time it was envisaged that the capital base would be sufficient for the annual earnings to replace the Government appropriation, making it a perpetual fund.

The Land Fund itself, however, will remain the property of the Commonwealth.

The seventh special appropriation of \$141,451,000 took place on 3 July 2001, with \$52,606,000 being provided to the ILC. An amount of \$88,845,000 was invested in securities in accordance with section 39(10) of the *Financial Management and Accountability Act 1997 (FMA Act)*.

In the 2002/03 financial year \$143,997,000 special appropriation will be drawn down with \$53,553,000 being for the ILC.

STRUCTURE OF THE LAND FUND

From 1 January 1998 the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Land Fund became a Reserved Fund within the Commonwealth Public Account. From that date monies placed in the Land Fund must be invested in accordance with section 39(10) of the *Financial Management and Accountability (FMA) Act 1997*.

A further amendment to the *FMA Act*, constituting the replacement of the Reserved Money Fund by Special Accounts, took effect on 1 July 1999. The *Financial Management Legislation Amendment Act 1999* converted the Land Fund Reserve to a Special Account under section 20(1) of the *FMA Act* on 1 July 1999. As a consequence, the Land Fund Reserve became known as the Land Fund Account.

The Land Fund and its investments are administered by ATSIC under delegation from the Minister for Finance under section 193F(1)&(2) of the *ATSIC Act*. The Chief Finance Officer, ATSIC, was appointed the Minister's Delegate for that purpose by the Minister for Finance on 25 July 1997.

CONSULTATIVE FORUM

The Minister for Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs appoints a Consultative Forum on the investment policy of the Land Fund (Consultative Forum). This is a Committee through which the nominated ILC Directors and other appointees of the Minister can discuss investment policy of the Land Fund with the Delegate of the Minister for Finance and Administration.

The Consultative Forum, which met on two occasions in 2001-2002, consists of the Delegate, at least two nominated ILC Directors and such other persons the Minister considers appropriate.

PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

On 1 July 2001 the balance of the Land Fund stood at \$940,695,947.

On 3 July 2001 an amount of \$88,845,000 was appropriated to the Land Fund providing a base investment of \$1,029,540,947 (excluding accrued interest). The realised real return for the year 2001/02 was 3.58% annum on the revalued portfolio (including reserves and receivables). This is based on an inflation indexation factor of 2.70 as determined under section 193D(1) of the *ATSIC Act* and has been arrived at following the Australian Investment Management Association (AIMA) guidelines on performance standards.

The real return achieved on investments for 2001-2002 was in excess of the 2.50% per annum that was identified as the requirement at 30 June 2001 to reach the June 2004 target balance. The strong performance of the return on the Land Fund's investments for the financial year has again significantly reduced the on-going required real yield for the remainder of the Category A years to 30 June 2004.

At 30 June 2002, the required real return to reach the target is 2.00% per annum.

The duration of the portfolio fell from 5.2 years at the beginning to 4.26 years at the end of the financial year. This was primarily caused by a proportionate decrease in holdings of longer maturity Inflation-Linked Bonds (ILBs) and was considered an appropriate strategy given the reducing inflation risk due to the shortening horizon to the Land Fund's first target value of 30 June 2004.

The decision to reduce the split of ILB to nominal investments in the portfolio from 75/25 to 70/30 was also taken partly due to the shortage of government issued ILBs. In the 2001-2002 financial year, the issuance only covered approximately half the coupon payments from existing ILBs available for re-investment in the market.

Investments during the year were made in securities prescribed by the *FMA Act*. These included Commercial Bank Bills, Floating Rate Notes, Capital Indexed Bonds, Nominal Bonds and At Call Account.

During 2001-2002 the Fund benefited from capital gains from the bond holdings, as well as from a gain on shorter term ILBs. On the whole, the Fund's strategy continues to seek to balance the need to minimize the risk of a shortfall of the June 2004 target, against the prudent desire to limit the reinvestment risk (ie, the risk that maturing investments cannot be re-invested at sufficiently high yields), from that time forward.

As June 2004 approaches, notwithstanding that the Fund has benefited from more favourable market conditions to date than had been counted upon, this is becoming an increasingly challenging balance.

International investment consultants, Frank Russell Company Pty Ltd (Frank Russell Company) were again contracted during 2001-2002 to produce an updated analysis of the ability of the Land Fund to generate sufficiently strong real yields post July 2004 (Category B years) to allow the ILC to carry out its legislative agenda.

The resulting submission, addressing the identified shortcomings, will be forwarded to the Minister for Finance and Administration in early 2002-2003. This is substantially a follow-on document to the submission of May 1996. The submission will also seek clarification to a number of issues regarding post 2004 payments from the Land Fund to the ILC.

A further submission will be made to the Minister for Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs regarding these matters.

FORWARD INVESTMENT STRATEGY

The Consultative Forum agreed that 2002-2003 appropriation monies be invested short, pending interest rates moving towards neutral possibly late 2002 or early 2003. As cash rates approach the 5.5% to 6.00% range, a greater part of the 2002-2003 appropriation will be placed in investments out to around a target duration of 4.5 year. Again, this strategy seeks to minimise the risk of a shortfall in the June 2004 target balance whilst also attempting to keep the longer-term goals in mind.

Frank Russell Company will be contracted again in 2002-2003 to provide advice on investments and continue to carry out reviews of the Fund's performance on a bi-annual basis.
